



#### THE COMPASSIONATE FATHER

On the First and Second Sundays of Lent new holy cards will be distributed to help us pray the Rite of Reconciliation. At the top of the holy card is a picture of the wayward son described in St Luke's Gospel, Chapter 15. It is a beautiful depiction of that moment when the returning son is compassionately embraced by his father.

We all need that embrace and we are all called to welcome someone else from the isolation of failing to do right. The mercy of God softens our hearts to make us ministers of Christ's forgiveness and reconciliation.

The Rite of Reconciliation provides a prayerful order for us to enter the experience of confession and absolution of our sins. It guides us through the experience of penance which is a grace-filled change, renewing our hearts in God's love. It is the channel of new life and growth as God's beloved friend.

The holy card contains an act of contrition by which we bear witness to our sorrow for our sins and a renewed commitment to live the teaching of the Lord. It is based on Psalm 51 which asks for the joy of salvation through the renewal of our heart that we might live in God's presence:

"Lord God, in your goodness have mercy on me: do not look on my sins, but take away all my guilt. Create in me a clean heart and renew within me an upright spirit."

These new cards will be given to everyone after Mass and they will be given to the children in our parish as they prepare for their First Reconciliation and Holy Communion.

Please take two of these holy cards home. Give one to the person who may need help to better understand the blessing of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We all struggle with our weaknesses and faults. Let us pray with trust and confidence in our gentle Father whose heart is filled with mercy for us.

#### Genesis 9:8-15

A reading from the book of Genesis

I will recall the covenant between myself and you... the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all

God spoke to Noah and his sons, 'See, I establish my Covenant with you, and with your descendants after you; also with every living creature to be found with you, birds, cattle and every wild beast with you: everything that came out of the ark, everything that lives on the earth. I establish my Covenant with you: no thing of flesh shall be swept away again by the waters of the flood. There shall be no flood to destroy the earth again.'

God said, 'Here is the sign of the Covenant I make between myself and you and every living creature with you for all generations: I set my bow in the clouds and it shall be a sign of the Covenant between me and the earth. When I gather the clouds over the earth and the bow appears in the clouds, I will recall the Covenant between myself and you and every living creature of every kind. And so the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all things of flesh.'

The water of the flood is a type of the baptism which saves

Christ himself, innocent though he was, died once for sins, died for the guilty, to lead us to God. In the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life, and, in the spirit, he went to preach to the spirits in prison. Now it was long ago, when Noah was still building that ark which saved only a small group of eight people 'by water', and when God was still waiting patiently, that these spirits refused

to believe. That water is a type of the baptism which saves you now, and which is not the washing off of physical dirt but a pledge made to God from a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has entered heaven and is at God's right hand, now that he has made the angels and Dominations and Powers his subjects.

#### REFLECTION by Fr Michael Tate The Rainbow

The Rainbow is God's signature to a treaty with humankind. On God's part, material forces will never be sent to annihilate human beings as a punishment for wrongdoing. On our part, as humans made in the likeness of God, we are to image God's rainbow relationship to nature.

This is the Divine Treaty basis of our responsibility for the environment. We undertake not to engage in practices or support policies which could severely damage the fragile ecology which supports life on our planet. The deforestation of the slopes of the Himalayas, leading to floods which kill thousands, is a catastrophic example. And, gazing at the rainbow, we can pray for our planet, for the human beings and all other creatures who inhabit it, and quite often for ourselves at a deep personal level. For we know that, just as after a storm and dark clouds, light penetrates the misty sky and the beautiful bow of colour appears, the same phenomenon can occur in our own lives.

We could take a moment to pray that the rainbow will appear, perhaps for ourselves, perhaps for others we know who are going through a stormy time.

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
