# The Month of May for Mary and World Children's Day

Dear Parishioners,

During May we especially think of Mary the Mother of Jesus, the Son of God. In Mary we admire the work of God's love and joyfully contemplate the fullness of grace to which we are all called.

During this month of devotion to Mary we will also celebrate the Church's first World Children's Day (25-26 May) when thousands of boys and girls will meet the Pope in Rome. Let us ask Mary our Mother to pray for children and a deepening of our acceptance and love of children.

In his message to children for this Day, Pope Francis reminds all children they are precious in God's eyes and they "are a source of joy" for their parents, families and the Church.

The theme Pope Francis has chosen for the World Day for Children is "Behold, I make all things new" (Rev 21:5). We make things new, the Pope explains, by taking little steps "like saying hello to others, asking permission, begging pardon, and saying thank you."

In reminding children that God "looks upon us with the eyes of a loving father and a gentle mother" who never forgets us, Pope Francis gives us a tender prayer we can say for all children as we look forward to the Church's first World Children's Day:

Come, Holy Spirit,

show us your beauty,

reflected in the faces

of children all over the world.

Come, Jesus,

you who make all things new,

who are the way that leads us to the

Father,

come and remain with us always.

Amen.

We are all beloved children of God. Therefore let us pray with Pope Francis and ask the Holy Spirit to help us see how we can more deeply accept and love children in our families and in parish community.

Dear children, you are delightful to the Heart of Jesus, and all of us pray that all your beautiful gifts of mind and heart will shine in our world.

#### Cf John 15:1,5

I am the true vine and you are the branches, says the Lord. Whoever remains in me, and I in him, bears fruit in plenty, alleluia.

### REFLECTION by Fr Michael Tate Spiritual Drink

We are too familiar with today's gospel. Christ is the vine and we are the branches, sometimes in need of a good pruning. But God's purpose is not to produce a perfect vineyard. It is to produce a full-bodied wine at the end of history.

There is a foretaste of this at every Mass. The wine we offer – 'fruit of the earth and work of human hands' – becomes the spiritual drink which best serves the purpose of our Heavenly Father. How does this happen?

For the Jewish people observing an animal whose throat is cut, it is obvious that the life drains out with the blood. 'Life' and 'blood' became synonyms. So, when the Jewish Jesus says of the wine in the chalice at the Last Supper: 'This is my blood', amongst other things he is saying: 'This is my life force, this is my very life given unreservedly for you.'

So, when we drink from the chalice at Holy Communion, the life of the Risen Lord courses through our bodies just as the sap of the vine courses through its branches. We share the same ultimate vitality so that our bodily existence builds into the Body of Christ. He becomes truly 'full-bodied' as the Divine Vigneron desires. We could take a moment to pray that we respond to the pruning and the tending and the pressing by our Heavenly Father so as to contribute our distinctive character to the vintage at the end of history, the spiritual drink of the Kingdom of Heaven.

### THIS WEEK'S READINGS & COMMENTARY

### **Entrance Antiphon**

Cf Psalm 97:1-2

O sing a new song to the Lord, for he has worked wonders; in the sight of the nations he has shown his deliverance, alleluia.

#### First Reading

Acts of the Apostles 9:26-31

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

He explained how the Lord appeared to Saul and spoke to him on his journey.

When Saul got to Jerusalem he tried to join the disciples, but they were all afraid of him: they could not believe he was really a disciple. Barnabas, however, took charge of him, introduced him to the apostles, and explained how the Lord had appeared to Saul and spoken to him on his journey, and how he had preached boldly at Damascus in the name of Jesus. Saul now started to go round with them in Jerusalem, preaching fearlessly in the name of the Lord. But after he had spoken to the Hellenists, and argued with them, they became determined to kill him. When the brothers knew, they took him to Caesarea, and sent him off from there to Tarsus.

The churches throughout Judaea, Galilee and Samaria were now left in peace, building themselves up, living in the fear of the Lord, and filled with the consolation of the Holy Spirit.
