## MARY, THE HOLY MOTHER OF GOD



This Sunday we celebrate the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God. This is the greatest of the titles the Church celebrates in honour of Mary. It does not affirm that Mary in any way is greater than God. But it is a very strong statement about who Jesus is and Mary's true relationship with him as his human mother. Jesus is truly the Son of the Most High and is also truly the Word made flesh who dwells among us. In calling Mary Mother of God we are emphasising the deepest identity of Jesus as truly God, this One who truly has a human mother.

One of the titles we give to Mary is Queen of Peace. In times of trial we turn to Mary and ask for her intercession that we would experience peace, even when events around us or the state of our hearts make it very difficult to be at peace.

Why do we ask Mary to pray for us that we would have this peace? Mary knew the peace that comes from being close to Jesus, her Son, our Saviour, even when life was far from comfortable and perfect. Mary knew the loving support of Joseph for her and her Child when she was most vulnerable. Mary received the Shepherds who had come to see Christ after they had heard the angel's announcement of God's peace to all of good will. Mary must have marvelled at the Wise Men from the east who came bearing rich gifts for the Saviour of all the nations of the world. Mary knew how to receive all kinds of people into her life and the life of her Son.

In her capacity for warm welcome Mary lived what Pope Francis has called us to do on this 56th World Day of Peace: Mary restored the word 'together' to a central place. In her mother's heart she perceived the common humanity that bound all these people together as children of God and she welcomed them.

Mary, mother so tender and so respectful of our need for welcome and acceptance, help us to be bearers of Christ's love and peace. Pray that we will let go of our bitterness and discord. Help us to have hearts that love, that generously give to others what they justly need, and open our lives to them in a spirit of harmony that brings everyone together in peace.

From all of us in the Lumen Christi office and on behalf of Bishop Brian and all the clergy, have a great 2023!

#### **REFLECTION by Fr Michael Tate** The Calendar-Shattering Mary

It is fitting that on New Year's Day we celebrate the calendarshattering event in human history: the extraordinary role that a young woman in Galilee played in God's plan for the human race.

In the Western Church, the young woman is titled 'Mother of God'. This signifies a relationship, a loving, nurturing relationship. We know that it encompassed a mother's horror of seeing her son tortured and done to death on the Cross. Yes, she was a mother, but Mother of God.

How can this be portrayed for our minds to grasp? In the Book of Genesis, the creative act which began all reckoning of the passage of time and seasons was signalled by the Divine Wind hovering over the formless void.

When that Holy Gust hovered over Mary, and she responded: 'Be it done unto me according to thy Word', the human existence of Our Lord Jesus Christ began, the fulcrum of history from which our calendar begins.

We could pause for a moment to pray that at the end of all history, at the end of all calendars, we may share in Divine life with Mary of Galilee, Mother of God.
