

#### **RENEWAL OF CATHEDRAL STATUES**

Dear Parishioners.

On my recent visit to Assisi in Italy (May) I was reminded of the power of sacred imagery. In the very old church of Santa Maria Maggiore, the body of Blessed Carlo Acutis is kept in a glass casket for visitors to see and ask his prayers. He is dressed very casually in jeans, sweater, and Nike boots. Carlo died of leukemia in 2006 at the age of 15. His Feast Day is October 12.



While Carlo's parents didn't have much faith, he had a deep and personal love of the Eucharist, attended Mass daily, and prayed the Rosary. He was also a computer programmer, loved soccer, and defended other children who were picked on by others, especially if they were disabled. Carlo stated: "To always be close to Jesus, that's my life plan."

Images connect us to people. We are linked to how they viewed the world, what they valued and how they lived. Sacred imagery, likewise, is very important for our life of Christian devotion. We are moved to love and imitate those represented by statues and paintings in our places of worship.

So, I wish to especially thank the anonymous parishioner who donated money for the renewal of the statues of Our Lady, St Joseph and St Anthony of Padua in the Cathedral. This gift honours these beautiful saints. It is a service to all who will see the renewed statues and be touched by the loving presence and prayers of Mary, Joseph, and Anthony.

#### **Entrance Antiphon**

Cf. Ps 26:7,9

O Lord, hear my voice, for I have called to you; be my help. Do not abandon or forsake me, O God, my Saviour!

#### First Reading

A reading from the book of Exodus

#### You will be a kingdom of priests, a consecrated nation.

From Rephidim the Israelites set out again; and when they reached the wilderness of Sinai, there in the wilderness they pitched their camp; there facing the mountain Israel pitched camp.

Moses then went up to God, and the Lord called to him from the mountain, saying, 'Say this to the House of Jacob, declare this to the sons of Israel, "You yourselves have seen what I did with the Egyptians, how I carried you on eagles' wings and brought you to myself. From this you know that now, if you obey my voice and hold fast to my covenant, you of all the nations shall be my very own, for all the earth is mine. I will count you a kingdom of priests, a consecrated nation."

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans

We have been reconciled to God through the death of his Son; we are saved by his life.

We were still helpless when at his appointed moment Christ died for sinful men. It is not easy to die even for a good man - though of course for someone really worthy, a man might be prepared to die but what proves that God loves us is that Christ died for us while we were still sinners. Having died to make us righteous, is it likely that he would now fail to save us from God's anger? When we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, we were still enemies; now that we have been reconciled surely we may count on being saved by the life of his Son? Not merely because we have been reconciled but because we are filled with joyful trust in God, through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have already gained our reconciliation.

Mt 9:36 - 10:8

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

He summoned his twelve disciples, and sent them out.

When Jesus saw the crowds he felt sorry for them because they were harassed and dejected, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, 'The harvest is rich but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to his harvest." He summoned his twelve disciples, and gave them authority over unclean spirits with power to cast them out and to cure all kinds of diseases and sickness.

These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon who is called Peter, and his brother Andrew: James the son of Zebedee. and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas, and Matthew the tax collector; James the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; Simon the Zealot and Judas Iscariot, the one who was to betray him. These twelve Jesus sent out, instructing them as follows: 'Do not turn your steps to pagan territory, and do not enter any Sa-

maritan town; go rather to the lost sheep of the House of Israel. And as you go, proclaim that the kingdom of heaven is close at hand. Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out devils. You received without charge, give without charge.'

There is one thing I ask of the Lord, only this do I seek: to live in the house of the Lord all the days of my life.

#### REFLECTION by Fr Michael Tate Guts in a Knot

When Jesus saw the crowds 'he felt sorry for them'. The Greek original actually says 'his guts were in a knot'. When Jesus saw a desperate need he found it stomach-churning stuff.

Our bodies often tell us what we should pray for. Another good signal is tears, not only of sadness but also of joy.

Body-felt impulse and prayer go together, whether celebrating good things or confronting bad things. This is what our Lord wants and, where possible, leading to effective action... labourers in the harvest. So, when our body gives us the signal – stomach in a knot, or tremendous joy flooding into our lives – follow the body's signals. Pray for the person or the situation concerned. You can be sure that your prayer will be authentic.
